#### Different dimensions

The Beatitudes are about seeing things quite differently. For this exhibit, Jacqui Frost started with photographic images, from the "real" world.. But these images are just two dimensional.



It's hard to imagine what heaven is about, but it's certainly got dimensions beyond our understanding!

Jacqui has sewn on a variety of threads, beads and "jewels". These link in - and

also create a tension - with the photos. From a distance we see a picture, close up we see how the images have been decorated with precious things: take a good look at the variety of "riches" awaiting the blessed.

#### Salt of the earth, light of the world



In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus followed on from the Beatitudes with two more great statements: - " You are the salt of the earth ... You are the light of the world..." Take a look at the way Jacqui has

portrayed" salitness and light on the final screens.



"Let me tell you why you are here. you're here to be salt-seasoning that brings out the God flavours of this earth.

You're here to be light bringing out the God colours in this world.



# The Beatitudes



As you walk round a beautiful cathedral, you'll see the work of dedicated craftsmen and artists from many centuries right up to the present. Their work is to the glory of God - or, in Latin, "Deo Gloria".

#### Textile artist Jacqui Frost introduces the screens:

Blessed. It's a word that means different things to different people. Maybe you reckon it's the same as lucky. or fortunate. Or it's about getting the good things from life. Or just simply being happy.


When Jesus spoke to a large crowd (in what is today known as the Sermon on the Mount) on a hill near the Sea of Galilee, he began with a set of startling statements that are now called the Beatitudes (the word comes from Latin - beatus, blessed). They make up an extraordinary message that turns the world upside down. They're an enormous encouragement when you're up against it, and a real challenge for when life's too comfortable!

Jesus' message was that being blessed is nothing to do with earthly prosperity or a happiness that relies on success or possessions. He meant a life that could include sadness and suffering ... poverty and hunger ... pain and stress ... How on earth could that be blessed? He meant being able to live in hope and expecting joy, keeping your eyes on a longer term goal, life after death,

There are some beautiful traditional translations of the Beatitudes, and I love the richness of the different words. If you're familiar and more comfortable with the traditional words, you may prefer to look at the images first and match them to the words you already know. Then take a look at the words I've stitched here: I love the directness and grittiness of the words I've used here from the Message, the bible in contemporary language.

You're blessed when you're at the end of your rope. With less of you, there is more of God and his rule.


You're blessed when you feel you've lost what is most dear to you. Only then can you be embraced by the One most dear to you.
